

What's New at School

Calhoun High is undergoing approximately \$10M in renovations, repairs, and improvements to its infrastructure over a three-year period which started in the summer of 2014. Part of a larger bond proposal of \$49.864M (approved in December 2013) bringing improvements to all five schools in the district, almost 54% of this funding (\$26.984M) will be paid by the New York State School Building Program.

This is the first time since 1966 that the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District has issued a bond, and the first solely devoted to improving the infrastructure of its schools. Phase I, now completed at Calhoun, addressed three major areas: security, repair of classroom and the gymnasium floors, and the installation of artificial turf on the playing fields.

Expanded security measures will allow greater control over who enters the building. This includes card access control for all staff; a video intercom to screen visitors; increased video surveillance; a "door ajar" notification which will prevent doors from being propped open; a one-button lock down system; and the installation of strobe lights on the outside of the building to be used should there be a lock-down.

The asbestos floor tiling in fifteen class rooms was replaced with new vinyl tiles and the gym floor was sanded, damaged areas repaired, its lines repainted and then resealed — all ready for the new school year.

The most talked about upgrades in Phase I were the improvements to the playing fields at all five schools. Poor drainage resulting in muddy fields and the inability to effectively grow grass were the majors factors leading to the decision to upgrade to artificial turf.

Maintaining grass (and there was very little left in a wide and long swath of the football field at Calhoun) had become more difficult to do because many chemicals — fertilizer, herbicides and pesticides, once in common use — are either banned outright or their application severely limited by the NY State Education Department.
